HOLY, PRECIOUS, CLEANSING BLOOD

Without the shedding of blood there is no forgiveness (Hebrews 9:22).

Many of us have an aversion to blood. We don't like the sight of it. Seeing it makes us feel sick to our stomachs or even pass out. *Doc Martin*, a popular TV show in Britain from a few years ago, portrays a doctor who suddenly develops a distaste for the sight of blood. As you can imagine, this leads to many comic moments.



There was nothing comic about what went on at the Temple in Jerusalem for centuries. Priests, who were also skilled butchers, slaughtered and dismembered animals, and burned up their carcasses on the altar. Once a year, on the Great Day of Atonement, the high priest took a bowl of blood with him into the Holy of Holies. Over and over again he dipped his hands into the blood and sprinkled it on the Ark of the Covenant. Those with an aversion to the sight of blood would have had a hard time serving in the priesthood or even witnessing the worship of God's Old Testament people. The blood flowed freely for about fifteen centuries.


Why all these bodies? Why all this blood? God was teaching his people some important lessons. First, he was teaching his people that sin is a serious matter. Sin is not just an error in judgment, a momentary lapse. Sin is rebellion against God. And so sin costs a life. Sin requires blood in payment. Second, God was teaching his people the principle of substitution. God wanted them to understand that he forgives sins by transferring the punishment for sin from guilty sinners to an innocent substitute.

Isn't that what Lent is all about? Isn't that what Christianity is all about? God transferred our sin and guilt to an innocent Substitute, his one and only Son. "God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God" (2 Corinthians 5:21). Martin Luther expressed it this way: "Lord Jesus, you are my righteousness, I am your sin. You became what you were not, that I might become what I was not."

We usually think of blood as something to be avoided. We learn special methods for cleaning it up safely and getting its stain out of our clothes. However, Christ's blood is not something to be avoided, but rather embraced. In fact, we can pray: Lord Jesus, bleed on me. Yes, Lord, bleed all over me. Cleanse me with your precious, holy blood."

"Without the shedding of blood there is no forgiveness." So Christ Jesus, our Great High Priest, our brother in the flesh and yet true God from all eternity, shed his own blood on the cross for us. We are pure and perfect, holy and righteous in the eyes of our God. We are forgiven.

Immanuel's History in History

1997 to 2006

On Tuesday, September 11, 2001, two hijacked commercial aircraft struck the World Trade Center in Manhattan, bringing both twin towers to the ground, and, sadly, taking almost 3,000 lives down with them. The same day, another plane hit the Pentagon in Washington D.C., and another crashed in Pennsylvania. I remember this day. I was in the kindergarten classroom at Immanuel with Mrs. Connie Allen. I watched footage of the tragedy on TV, but at that young age, it was such a distant event. Manitowoc and Immanuel were my whole world. I had no way to understand how such an event could impact our nation and the world. It was a time of change for foreign policy, for the military, and for airport and border security.



Manitowoc and Immanuel were experiencing change as well, only in relatively calmer ways. The new Gathering Room and office area were completed in 1997. Principal Arvon Peter retired in 1999, and James Roecker took over as Immanuel's principal. Mirro moved out of Manitowoc in 2001, much to the dismay of many citizens who had been employed there or were otherwise impacted by the large company. That same year, Pastor Loren Lindemann was installed as our second parish pastor alongside Pastor Dennis Broehm. This was the first time in Immanuel's history that we had two pastors. This pattern continued when, in 2004, Pastor Paul Schosow replaced Pastor Dennis Broehm. At the end of this decade in 2006, with new technology flooding into our daily lives, Immanuel's school and church website got a major facelift.

I still hold childhood memories of growing up in Immanuel's church and school during this decade. Being the Little Red Hen was a highlight of preschool with Mrs. Linda Verlinden. In kindergarten we got to sing in front of church, and this continued through 8th grade. I still remember, as a young child, appreciating the opportunity to share God's Word with the whole congregation in such a public way. Immanuel celebrated its 75th anniversary in 2002, and I have never forgotten the handmade "75 years" banner at the front of church. Some of my favorite memories of church at Immanuel were Sunday School and Christmas services. The annual Children's Christmas Eve service was held in the gym as it is now, and at the time, the Sunday School students put on their own Christmas service in the sanctuary, complete with costumes and candles. Every Wednesday I would walk over with the whole student body to the sanctuary for chapel. We had the opportunity to put our coins and dollars in the little orange mission offering envelopes each time. Do you remember the simple joy of placing coins in the offering plate as a child? May the Gospel continue to bring us joy in giving to the Lord with the same childlike faith during this anniversary celebration and always.

The A Boys tournament finishes up all the basketball tournaments for our teams. The boys won their opening round game and then lost a “nail biter” by two in their next game. Later that afternoon they won which then put them into the fifth place game. This final game of their season was another close one, however, they couldn’t quite pull it off. As you can see, it was another nice sports season for our students. It was great to see them work hard and grow as they progressed through the year. Thanks to the many fans who came to games either at our gym or at MLHS during the tournaments. It was nice to have many Immanuel people cheering our boys and girls on!

We also have a number of guys who are on the Jr. Lancer Wrestling team. They practice at MLHS and then go to a number of Saturday tournaments. Our upper graders will look ahead to the next and final sport of the year, track. We will be entered in two track meets. Maybe you could join us for one of the May track meets and cheer for the Hornets!



There are two new books that will be coming into our church library in the near future.

◆ *Food at the Time of the Bible* by Miriam Feinburg Vamosh. Within this easy to read book are every type of foods found in the Bible. The book is filled with photographs and illustrations. Not only will the reader learn what people ate and drank during Bible times but also how the food was raised, stored, traded, and prepared. There are also many recipes using these foods. A 110 minute DVD of the Holy Land is included, however, know that there is a lot of Catholicism when doctrine and tradition are mentioned.



◆ *Life at the Time of Jesus* by Miriam Feinburg Vamosh. This book features many illustrations, maps, and photographs of life in the New Testament times. Archaeological finds of the past half century are shown. Again there is a 110 minute DVD is available, but the reader needs to use judgment when viewing.

BOOK DISCUSSION GROUP:

In the first century BC, Herod the Great built a fortress on a plateau 1440 feet above the eastern shore of the Dead Sea which was called Masada. After his death in 4 BC, Masada became a Roman garrison until there was a revolt by a group known as Zealots who captured the fortress. Jewish refugees were escaping from Jerusalem to Masada after the Roman army in 70 AD destroyed the temple. This is background for the book discussion group for March.

The Dovekeepers by Alice Hoffman is a historical fiction novel of four women who come to the top of Masada in 70 AD. Although fiction, there is much in the novel that does tell the ending of Masada. Discussed are the Essenes who had copied many of the books of the Bible and hid the scrolls in clay pots. These scrolls were found in 1947 and are called THE Dead Sea Scrolls. Hoffman writes of Ein Gedi where King David hid in caves away from Saul. Much is told of the idolatry of the Israelites.
