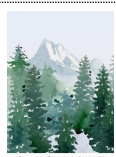

Grade 3

What a wonderful Veteran's Day celebration! Our class recited their poem very well. This week we compared and contrasted the book and movie for Stone Fox. Students were also given the choice to write a new ending for the book, or write the next chapter. Surprisingly, most of the students wrote *What Happens Next, even though Searchlight died on the last page. We created a book of our writing that will proudly be sent home in Friday Folders.* In Social Studies we are learning about the early explorers. In English, we added Compound Sentences (CD), and Natural/Inverted Order. In Reading, we are pivoting to Nonfiction. Book orders are included in Friday folders.

Grade 4

The 4th graders finished the week publishing their 3-paragraph essays on their favorite animals. Next up: 5-paragraphs! They are doing a great job finding details to compare and contrast our read aloud book with the movie version. We are getting into lots of new math content. Students learned about liquid capacity this week. Keep reading at least 20 minutes every night to work toward AR goals.

They did a wonderful job honoring our veterans on Wednesday with their reader's theater play! We look forward to our next field trip this month: Nov. 21 to MLHS. Have a blessed weekend!
