<u>Registration for the 2024-25 School Year</u> ~ Registration for the 2024-25 school year is now open! You should have received an email from TADS with a link to register for next school year. If you did not receive an email, please let us know as soon as possible. We are expecting some of our classrooms to be at capacity next year, so it is very important that all students are re-enrolled as soon as possible in order to hold their spot. <u>If you know that your</u> child will not be returning to Immanuel next year, you can also note that through TADS or let us know via email. If you have any questions, please be sure to let us know; we would be happy to help.

The school board approved the following fees for the 2024-25 school year:

- The **milk fee** was increased from \$40/year to \$65/year to cover the increase in the price of milk over the past year.
- The **hot lunch fee** will remain at \$65/year for students in grades 3-8 and \$45/year for students in K-2.
- The **athletic fee** for students in grades 1-2 will remain at \$15/year. The fee for students in grades 3-8 will remain at \$50/year. This fee will only be charged to students who plan to participate in an Immanuel-sponsored sport (soccer-fall only, volleyball, cross-country, basketball, and track).
- The **technology fee** will remain at \$50/year for students in grades 1-8.
- The member of Immanuel/Prospect tuition rate for next year will be \$1350/student. The non-member of Immanuel tuition rate will be \$3250/student. Both of these amounts include a \$50 non-refundable registration fee. (FYI - Immanuel's cost per student was around <u>\$7000/student</u> for the 2023-24 school year.)
- PLEASE NOTE: Immanuel does have a **financial aid program** for families who are in need of tuition assistance. Please speak to Mr. Wilson for more information about the program.
