We Prepare for God's Mercy

Dear friends, God's good news awakens two responses in a human heart: an intense

longing for him and an equally intense resentment. On the one hand we want forgiveness from our merciful God. But, on the other hand, our pride resists the truth that every one of us are helpless to right the wrongs we have committed against our Holy God. The truth that we cannot earn or win anything from God is impossible to accept on our own. Either we must receive his grace **as a gift** or **do without** it. He will do nothing for us if we think we are sufficient of ourselves. So, we confess that we are destitute and can only approach him with empty hands.

We Admit Our Guilt

Lord Jesus, you told us to be perfect as God the Father is perfect.

We confess that we, like all people, sin and fall short of that standard.

We have not even perfectly loved those who love us.

And we have neglected to do so many other things you command.

So with bowed heads and humbled hearts we can only plead,

Father, we have sinned against others and you; forgive us for Jesus' sake.

God Promises the Certainty of Our Forgiveness

After King David confessed his guilt, the prophet Nathan eagerly shared this truth, "The Lord has taken away your sins!" Jesus once comforted a sinful woman by reassuring her, "Your sins are forgiven." And after his resurrection he announced to his disciples, "As the Father sent me, I am sending YOU... If you forgive anyone their sins, they are forgiven." My friends, you've confessed your own sins today; believe God's good news of forgiveness for you. Through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, YOUR sins are forgiven!

Message from God's Word – John 15:1-8

"I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener. ² He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes so that it will be even more fruitful. ³ You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you. ⁴ Remain in me, as I also remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me. ⁵ "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing. ⁶ If you do not remain in me, you are like a branch that is thrown away and withers; such branches are picked up, thrown into the fire and burned. ⁷ If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. ⁸ This is to my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples."
