## FULFILLMENT IN 2024?

So, we're a month out from the start of 2024 ... have you stuck with your plans to change?

Did you stop (overeating, smoking, drinking) and start (being a better parent, doing a better job at work, living a healthier lifestyle)? Will keeping your resolutions truly give you satisfactions in 2024? What happens when/if you break these personal promises - then what kind of emotions set in? Frustration: "I can't believe it is February and I am already back to my same unhealthy diet." Despair: "I am never going to be able to stop doing..." Failure: "Why even try? This is impossible. I'm a loser."



Then there are all the things that are completely out of your control. The winter storm that causes expensive damage. The climbing interest rates which cause your loan payments to be a little more stressful. The boss who decides someone else will be promoted this year even though you worked harder and performed better. Can we ever find true and lasting satisfaction in this kind of world?

## Sunday Family Bible Study

Join us for Family Bible Study on Sunday mornings between worship services to dig deeper into God's truths for us in our lives. During challenging times and joyful times, we learn to fix our eyes on Jesus, His truths, how vital He is in our lives, and our eternal future. Each week we explore a different topic so join us anytime. God has so much to tell us, to help us, at all times!



Our study is taught in a relaxed, family atmosphere. All ages are welcome! There are activity pages for the children that correlate with the lesson being studied, and they participate in the beginning of Bible study with their parents. At 9:50am, children are welcome to go with a teacher to the room across the hall. There they learn and explore the same portion of God's Word through felt board, video, crafts, etc. and sing praises to Jesus. At 10:10am the children are brought back to their parents in Bible study. Parents have the option of their children staying with them for all of Bible study; in this case parents with little ones may wish to bring along a snack or coloring book for them.

Our Bible study is held in the Fellowship Hall (church basement) from 9:30 AM to 10:15 AM.

#### God + Me Class

Make a resolution to be closer to God this year. The God + Me class began on Monday, January 29th. We meet at 6:00 PM in the Fellowship Hall, located in the lower level of church. The God + Me Class explores the basic truths of the Bible and briefly compares some simple differences between religions and various Christian denominations. Most importantly, it answers the questions every person needs to know in life...who am I?... what's




my purpose in life?... how can I get to heaven?... how can I be certain I am loved and forgiven?... how does the Bible apply to me?







## How can life insurance be used to benefit the church and/or synod?

You can give an existing or a new life insurance contract to the church, making the church the owner and the beneficiary of the contract. At your death, the church will receive the death benefit. You will receive a charitable deduction for your income taxes. If you give a new insurance contract, you can deduct the amount of the annual premiums you pay each year to keep the insurance in force. If you give an existing insurance contract you can claim an immediate income tax deduction based on the less of (1) the cash value of the insurance contract or, (2) the aggregate amount of the paid premiums.

Alternatively, you can remain the owner of the insurance contract, but name the church as primary beneficiary. Although you will not receive an income tax deduction, your estate will be entitled to an estate tax deduction for the amount of the death benefit. You can also name the church/synod as a contingent beneficiary, meaning that the church receives the death benefits only if the primary beneficiary dies before you do.

Gifts to the Endowment Fund are gifts from the heart that keep on giving and further Immanuel's work and mission of spreading God's Word.

If your group has a ministry idea or project in need of special funding, please complete the "Grant Request Form" that can be found in the Church gathering room or contact a member of the ILEF Committee. **The deadline to submit requests for 2024 is February 29, 2024.**
