





HOLY WEEK WORSHIP

- † PALM SUNDAY worship focuses on our Savior's triumphant entry into Jerusalem. We worship and rejoice before our Lord at 8:00 AM and 10:30 AM on Sunday, March 24th.
- **†** HOLY THURSDAY is the day when our Savior instituted the Lord's Supper and was betrayed into the hands of his enemies. We celebrate at 4:00 PM and 6:30 PM on Thursday, March 28th, with worship and Communion.
- * GOOD FRIDAY is the day when Jesus died on the cross as our great Substitute. On Friday, March 29th, there will be a worship service at 1:00 PM and at 6:30 PM. Both services are the same.

Sunday Family Bible Study

Join us for Family Bible Study on Sunday mornings between worship services to dig deeper into God's truths for us in our lives. During challenging times and joyful times, we learn to fix our eyes on Jesus, His truths, how vital He is in our lives, and our eternal future. Each week we explore a different topic so join us anytime. God has so much to tell us, to help us, at all times!



Our study is taught in a relaxed, family atmosphere. All ages are welcome! There are activity pages for the children that correlate with the lesson being studied, and they participate in the beginning of Bible study with their parents. At 9:50am, children are welcome to go with a teacher to the room across the hall. There they learn and explore the same portion of God's Word through felt board, video, crafts, etc. and sing praises to Jesus. At 10:10am the children are brought back to their parents in Bible study. Our students have used their God given physical talents to glorify Him in athletics.

SOCCER happens in the fall and is available to any student in grades 1-8. We had a 1-2 grade team, a 3-4 grade team as well as a 5-8 grade team. Each of the teams got to play in two tournaments. The students all played hard. One of the 1-2 grade teams brought home a 1st place trophy! We thank the coaches in grades 1-2 - Brad Weber, Christine Brockmann, and Jennifer Olson. Thanks go to Justin Skarvan and Krystal Gossen for coaching the 3-4 grade team and to Nate Reis, Jason DeVries, and Joshua Halligan who worked with the 5-8 graders.

Also available in the fall for the girls is VOLLEYBALL. We had a B Team made up of 5-6 graders and an A Team made of 7-8 graders from Immanuel and First German. The B Team, coached by Jaimie Carlson, Jennifer Holschbach, and Sara Stuebs (Thank You for coaching), played on four different Tuesdays and played against a number of other league schools. They also were involved in one tournament. The A Team had 12 matches and then played in the League Tournament at the end of the season in which they were the 3rd place winners! Thank you to A Team Head Coaches Amy Nelson, Cristin Svatek, and Mark Svatek.

Two of our students joined the JR. LANCER CROSS COUNTRY team (coached by Joel Putz!) and ran regularly in practices and meets in the fall. Then more joined those Immanuel runners for the League Meet held in October at MLHS. We had about 14 total on the Immanuel team.

BASKETBALL started in October and ran into January. We had B Teams for boys and girls made of 5-6 graders and A Teams for girls and boys made of 7-8 graders. The A teams were joined by players from First German. Each of the teams played 6-7 regular season games and then played in a

tournament at the end of the season. For our B Teams in the tournament, the girls played some good basketball and picked up a few wins. The B Team Boys also had some victories in their tournament. In the A Team Girls Tournament, our Immanuel/ First German G Girls played some of their best basketball of the season and played exciting games. Immanuel Lutheran Endowment Fund (ILEF) founded in 2003

What is an Endowment Fund?

We have all heard of or talked about Checking and Savings Accounts, Certificates of Deposit, 401Ks, IRAs or Money Market Accounts. We understand how these accounts "work" since many of us own one or more of these accounts. We are comfortable with them. We use them to hold our funds temporarily or long-term so that the deposited money will grow for future use.

Immanuel's Endowment Fund is no different than any of the aforementioned accounts. The Fund is used to hold donated money for growth and future use to support Immanuel's Church and School. The dictionary describes the word "endow" as "to furnish with funds for support." So you can think of Immanuel's Endowment Fund as a Savings Account, or a Money Market Account where the monetary donations given to the Endowment Fund will never be spent. The fund will continue to grow in principal as donations are given and only a portion of the investment earnings are used for Immanuel's mission. It is a smart investment to ensure the continued support of our Church and School now and in the future. As the Fund grows, that support becomes more significant.

Gifts to the Endowment Fund are gifts from the heart that keep on giving and further Immanuel's work and mission of spreading God's Word.

Immanuel's Endowment Fund (ILEF), focuses on the long-term financial future of our congregation.
