WHAT TO DO WITH YOUR FALL REFUSE

Do you have a favorite place to visit in the fall? I'm guessing THIS ONE isn't on your top ten list... my kids used to really enjoy going to the landfill with me. Why in the world was a stinky, messy, growing eyesore so fun? They loved climbing into the back of the truck and throwing sticks, leaves, grass and broken furniture into that enormous pit.

Oddly enough, in a way God invites you to treat HIM like a landfill. He encourages you this fall to "Cast ALL your anxiety on him because he cares for you!" (1 Peter. 5:7). "Pile it up!, Keep it coming! I can take it! Cover ME with it!"

Cast all your anxiety
ON HIM
because he cares
FOR YOU.

Of course the refuse God is asking you to cover him with is your anxiety. Your worry about what's next. The stresses from what's going on right now. The burdens weighing on you from the past. Everything that tends to pile up and make life feel like an endless battle. All the things that press down on you and cause pain, on the outside and inside.

God says he wants you to take all of those things, EVERY ONE, and "Throw it on me!" He wants your burdens and he wants your guilt because he wants you to be able to hold up under the stress of the present. He wants you to enjoy some certainty about your future.

I know it doesn't sound pleasant to throw these things on God. But it's all he wants from you. He's already taken so much – Jesus bore the sins of the ENTIRE world when he died on the cross. He didn't drop a single one. He didn't leave anyone out so that they're left carrying their own.

If you know someone who tends to help others so much it seems like they don't have any time left for themselves, then you know a tiny bit better about how God feels about all this. It's filled with love! So overflowing with love that no matter how many of your burdens you pile on him, his love will still spill all over you through Jesus. So don't be afraid. Go ahead and pile up ALL your fall refuse on him. Cast ALL your anxiety on him because he really, truly, cares for you.

GRIBFSHARE SESSION

GriefShare is a support ministry to help people who are grieving the loss of a loved one whether recent or in the past. Each session is about 2 hours long. There is a short video on various topics presented by mental health experts who have also gone through the grieving process. This is followed by group discussion time. Between each weekly session there is a workbook that has daily exercises that point you to God's Word and help you work through your grief.

School News

Our mission is to assist the families of our congregation and community in training their children, both spiritually and academically, through excellence in Christ-centered education.

FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL

The 2023-24 school year began on Wednesday, August 23rd, with an opening chapel service led by Pastor Bowe on our school theme, "I Am with You Always." We currently have 146 students enrolled in our school for the 2023-24 school year. This is up from 141 students last school year. There are 125 students in grades K-8 with an additional 21 students in our preschool program. We also have a number of families who have enrolled or are planning to enroll in our God + Me class with Pastor Zimpelmann. The Lord's harvest field in Manitowoc continues to be ripe! We thank God for continuing to bless the work being done through our church, school, and preschool!

CHALLENGES = OPPORTUNITIES

The increase in our enrollment over the past several years has certainly been a blessing, but it has also brought some challenges which, in turn, have brought increased opportunities for reaching out to our community with the Gospel. This school year, our 5th and 6th grades are being taught in a multi-grade classroom with a combined enrollment of 25 students. Next year, we are projecting that our 5th and 6th grades will have 37



students combined. With larger classes continuing to move up through our lower grades, the Board of Education is recommending that we call a new teacher in order to split those grades next year. Since we already have students on a waiting list for those grades, we are praying that adding a teacher will provide even more students the opportunity to enroll in our school so that they, too, can learn more about their Savior.

If the Lord blesses us with an additional teacher, that presents an additional challenge of finding classroom space for the new class. We are currently using every available classroom in our school building. In addition, we are also using the entire basement under the offices as our library and wrap-around care area. While arrangements can be made to provide classroom space on a temporary basis, we are studying the feasibility of adding three additional classrooms and a larger gathering space near the gymnasium to meet the expanding needs of our church, school and preschool. Please keep these challenges and opportunities in your thoughts and prayers as we strive to be the best stewards of the Lord's blessings.

Our gracious God has certainly showered his blessings on our church and school through the workers that He has called to serve at Immanuel. We especially thank the Lord of the Church for sending Ms. Alexandria Conrad to serve as our new first grade teacher at Immanuel. We are excited for her to join our ministry team! When Ms. Conrad was assigned in May, her call was issued as a one-year call so that she

We are happy to \$\frac{*}{2}\$ announce that she has completed the necessary requirements from MLC, and the * Synod's assignment committee has made her call here at Immanuel permanent! Please continue to keep all of our faculty and staff in your thoughts and prayers this school year!


