The Church Council has scheduled a special Voters' Meeting for Monday, October 8, at 7:30 PM to discuss and vote on the School Board's recommendation. God-willing, this will allow our congregation to issue a Divine Call when the Synod's Call window opens in the beginning of November. Please continue to keep our church and school in your thoughts and prayers during this time of transition.
